



Gordon Behind Bars: A New Look at Prison

Gordon Ramsay is world famous as a chef and as a personality. For most people, getting a single Michelin Star is a dream. Ramsay has 17. When he isn't running his restaurant or filming Hell's Kitchen or Masterchef, he even does triathlons. But underneath all his achievements, who is he?

Ramsay grew up in a poor family, his father was an alcoholic who was rarely around and sometimes violent. Ramsay was almost a professional soccer player, but at the age of 19, an injury ended his soccer career. During this time, he paid more attention on his other interest, which is cooking, he worked harder than other people, and now he becomes the most famous chef in the world.

With his fame, Ramsay can now take on projects and promote causes that he supports. In one program, called Gordon Behind Bars, he decided to help the prisoners in HMP (Her Majesty's Prison) Brixton, which is one of the worst prisons in England. Ramsay's difficult personal history means that he knows how people sometimes make bad choices and end up in prison. The government spends a lot of money for prisoners, including food, salary for prison guards, and health care. This money comes out of taxes. Ramsay believes that the biggest problem with the system is that most prisoners cannot find jobs when they get out, and they will commit crimes again because they don't know anything else.

In order to help these people, Ramsay decided to teach them skills that they can use once they leave HMP Brixton. He taught them how to bake, so that they could work from inside the prison to start a business called the Bad Boys Bakery. During this program, Ramsay and his team of convict chefs encounter many difficulties, but in the end they succeed and open up a small business that still runs today!

You may be wondering why we should spend so much time and effort to help criminals. I believe that it is important that we know people make mistakes, but society can still accept them. These mistakes do not always define them, and sometimes good people make mistakes too. If we teach them skills, like Ramsay says, then they can come out of prison and contribute to society, benefiting all of us. Imagine the long-term consequences of this idea. Is that a world you would like to live in?

A Cafe Review - Just Kids

If you live in Hsinchu, then you may be wondering where you can find a good drink and have a good place to study. Most people will go to Starbucks, but what if you want to go somewhere quieter, or cheaper? Well I'm here to help you!

Inside Zhong-Zheng Night Market, there is a small coffee shop called Just Kids. When I first heard about this, it was from a friend who told me that there was a cafe inside of a night market. He brought me there last year, and since then it has become one of my favorite places to study, work, or just hang out.

The food and drink at Just Kids is made by local chefs and bakers and sold through the cafe. The price of all food and drinks are about \$60-\$95NT. The interior of Just Kids is quite small - they don't even have a second floor - but it is special. They sell clothes in the cafe (also from independent creators in Hsinchu), and they recently added capsule toy machines ("Gashapon", in Japanese) in the store. You put coins into these machines and they dispense toys in plastic capsules. All these little details make Just Kids a very special place.

Since I discovered this secret cafe, hidden in a night market, I have returned there at least once per weekend. It is the perfect place to stop by after a day spent in town with your friends. Unlike other coffee shops such as Starbucks, it is quiet and secluded. I would recommend it to anyone. Go check it out, you won't regret it!

Earthquakes and International Aid

On the 19th of July, 2017 (the anniversary of the 1985 quake), a 7.1 magnitude earthquake hit Mexico City. This was a disastrous event that caused the deaths of many people in the city, Mexican, non-Mexican, and even some Taiwanese.

Only 3 days later, on July 22nd, 2017, another earthquake struck again, collapsing buildings such as highways and schools, killing 273 people. In addition to the people killed, many were buried underneath the rubble; a hellish scenario. Immediately, those who were safe found ways to help those who were not. One of the destroyed buildings was Taiwanese, which resulted in several Taiwanese nationals becoming casualty.

At times like these, when earthquakes and disasters strike and cause many losses, because we are located very far away, and we have no strong ties with Mexico, it can be easy to not know what to do to help. Eventually, however, the Taiwanese government donated \$100,000USD to Mexico to help with disaster relief work. This is important for Taiwan because being a part of the international community means that countries need to help each other.

On September 21st of 1999, Taiwan also suffered a harmful earthquake. At that time Mexico sent rescue teams to come to Taiwan and help us. We know what it is like to suffer from an earthquake, and so we were grateful for the help that Mexico sent us, and also for the chance to help them too. This is an important relationship to build and develop.

We can all help each other whether for community service or international aid. If you feel like you want to help but you do not know how, then just start small and help to build your own community. Giving back has to begin somewhere, so stop worrying about where and just start giving. As long as you have the will to help people and the heart to do it, then that is enough.

North Korea: What Should We Think?

In September of 2017, North Korea successfully tested a nuclear bomb and fired multiple missiles over Japan. These actions throughout the past month have caused serious tension between North Korea and other countries in the region. When North Korea fires missiles over Japan, the Japanese government must issue emergency evacuations to its citizens. The most recent missile tests flew over Hokkaido. Intelligence assessments from the United States claim that the missile has a range of 2700km, with a height of 550km. This means that a missile launched by North Korea could easily reach Guam, an American territory.

Many might wonder, why doesn't Japan try to intercept these missiles? Japanese academics have given mixed answers and opinions. The Japanese Defense Minister, Itsunori Onodera, has said that they allow the missiles to fly over because the targets are not in Japan. Other experts say that Japan cannot intercept the missiles for certain and they do not want to risk trying to intercept, failing, and allowing the world (and North Korea) to see that they are not able to defend themselves from missiles.

The entire international community condemned North Korea's actions. The United Nations increased economic sanctions against the country. These sanctions harmed North Korea's ability to export coal and iron. These actions, however, will probably not stop North Korea.

Any war in the region will definitely affect Taiwan. If America becomes involved in a war, they may increase their military presence in the Asia-Pacific region, which will probably mean that they will be able to defend Taiwan against China more easily. Furthermore, a nuclear war with North Korea will also divert China's attention and keep them very busy.

While the situation is quite concerning, there is not much that people can do except to hope that a peaceful solution is reached. Hopefully North Korea will realize that to fight a war with the United States or South Korea would be suicide, and so they will not do anything crazy. My suggestion is to keep an eye on the news, but hope for the best.

Alien Movie Review

Halloween is the perfect time to revisit some old classic horror movies. One of these is Alien, first released on June 22nd, 1979 (nearly 40 years ago), gave people around the world something new to fear. It was directed by Ridley Scott, the man behind other renowned films such as Gladiator, The Martian, and the original Blade Runner.

Alien was one of Scott's earlier works, and with its phenomenal cast and amazing visuals, is often regarded as a masterpiece. Alien straddles the line between science fiction and horror, bringing elements of each. With Scott's masterful use of camera angles, lighting, and sounds, Alien stands as a breakthrough work in the horror genre.

There were many elements that made Alien stand out upon its 1979 release (a year that yielded other classics such as Rocky II and Mad Max). It starred Sigourney Weaver and John Hurt whose acting performances helped to make the audience feel invested in the plot. Scott, as director, crafted each scene with a close attention to detail to ensure that every shot captured a particular feeling for the audience.

The movie opens with a creepy shot of deep space, giving the audience a look at the Nostromo (the vessel that the movie's heroes occupy). This shot is accompanied by a barely audible score by Jerry Goldsmith.

This movie has been praised for its pacing, taking its time to build suspense and tension before revealing the monster. Many scenes made use of innovative camera angles to help build anticipation, such as low angle shots to make a room appear larger. The setting, with its tight corridors and small vents, helps to create a claustrophobic atmosphere for the audience. Music helps to build and relieve tension in this thrilling rollercoaster of a movie.

Films become classics for a reason, and Alien is a perfect example of this. It was groundbreaking at the time, but it has stood the test of time and been recognized as unique, innovative, and ultimately masterful reinterpretation of science fiction and horror.







Art Submissions: Zentangles by Painting and Drawing
