

The Mustang: Evolution of an Icon

Cars have always been one of the most important inventions throughout history. In this article, I'm going to discuss the different generations in one specific car company. The company that I'm going to be introducing is Ford, one of my favorite companies of all time. The car model is the Mustang. Ford Mustang is an American muscle car manufactured by Ford. There are six generations of this car that have been produced. The first Ford Mustang was brought out five months before the normal start of the 1965 production year. The production of Ford began in Dearborn, Michigan on March 9th, 1964. The new car was introduced to the public on April 17, 1964 at New York World's Fair. The first generation of Ford Mustang was manufactured by Ford from March 1964 until 1973. The introduction of Mustang created a new class of automobiles known as "pony car".

The second generation was produced from 1973 until 1978, it was also known as Ford Mustang II. It was introduced in showrooms during September of 1973. The new Mustang II returned to a size closer to the 1965 model, ultimately winning the Motor Trend Car of the Year.



In 1979, Mustang introduced the third generation. The third generation was produced by Ford from 1979 until 1993. The third generation's production with the introduction of the fourth generation Mustang for the 1994 model year.



The fourth generation was produced by American manufacturer Ford for the 1994 to 2004 model years. The 1994 model year underwent its first major redesigns in fifteen years.

The fifth generation Mustang came one year after the fourth generation, from 2005 until 2014. It was manufactured in Michigan. It began with the 2005 model year, and was changed for the 2010 model year. The latest generation was from 2013 till present. The sixth generation is the current repetition of the Mustang pony car.



The sixth generation Mustang includes fully independent rear suspension on all models, it is also the first Ford Mustang that has been sold globally.

The Ford Mustang has become an iconic American car. To me, the best Ford Mustang is the third generation of Shelby Mustang introduced in 2015, because of its high performances with a top speed at 186 mph, and also with its long hood and short deck, proved wildly popular and inspired a host of competition.

Blake Griffin was traded to the Detroit Pistons! The Blake Griffin Trade was between the Clippers and the Pistons. According to the NBA, "the deal will send Griffin, guard Willie Reed, forward Brice Johnson and a second-round draft pick to Detroit for guard Avery Bradley, forward Tobias Harris, center Boban Marjanovic, plus a first-round and a second-round draft pick." On February 1st, Blake Griffin played his first game as a Piston against the Grizzlies, According to ESPN, "Griffin scored 24 points, grabbed 10 rebounds and dished out five assists as his new team pulled out a 104-102 win over the Memphis Grizzlies."

Isaiah Thomas was traded to the Los Angeles Lakers! The Cavaliers decided to trade Isaiah Thomas, Channing Frye, and their 2018 first round pick for two young players Larry Nance Jr. and Jordan Clarkson from the Lakers.

The Cavaliers continue a three team trade with Jazz and Kings. According to the NBA, "Cleveland has acquired Utah guard Rodney Hood and Sacramento guard George Hill in a three-team deal, the team announced. The Cavaliers will reportedly send Iman Shumpert to the Kings while dealing Jae Crowder and Derrick Rose to the Jazz. Joe Johnson also goes from Utah to Sacramento in the trade." Cavs really want to find a new way to fight for the NBA championship 2018.

The NBA All Star weekend started on February 16th and ended on February 18th and located at Staples Center, Los Angeles. On February 16th, there were NBA Celebrities Game and NBA Rising Stars Challenge, and the MVP of Celebrities Game is Quavo the rapper, and the MVP of the Rising Stars Challenge is Bogdan Bogdanovic from the Kings.

On February 17th, there were NBA Skill Challenge, 3 Point Contest, and Slam Dunk Contest. The winner of the Skill Challenge is Spencer Dinwiddie from the Nets. The winner of the 3 Point Contest is Devin Booker from the Suns. And finally, the winner of the Slam Dunk Contest is Donovan Mitchell from the Jazz.

On February 18th, was the NBA All Star Game, all of the best players in the league played in the game. Team LeBron had beaten Team Stephen 148-145, and LeBron James won the MVP award for the third time with 29 points, 10 rebounds and 8 assists in the All Star Game.

How I Became a Youtuber



Science, Clones, and Monkeys

Imagine a zoo where all the animals are cloned, where they not only look exactly the same, but also all share the same genes. This idea might seem somewhat strange, but it could actually be possible. Although it's more complicated than this, but in a way, animals can be copy and pasted. After several years of doing experiments and research, scientists have successfully made two clones of the same monkey. These two monkeys have proven that as technology advances, researchers and scientists have also been making lots of process on their research.

On November 27, 2017, the two monkeys were born in a lab located in Shanghai, China. They are a type of monkey called macaques. One monkey is named Zhong Zhong and the other is Hua Hua. Although they were not the first animals to be cloned, it is certainly still a huge breakthrough for scientists and researchers.

Monkeys have been cloned before Zhong Zhong and Hua Hua were born, but they were cloned through a different technique. After making Dolly the Sheep, this is the first time that primates have been successfully cloned using the newer technique. The technique is called somatic cell transfer (SCNT). This is when scientists reconstruct an unfertilized egg, the nucleus is removed and replaced with a nucleus from another cell. Then it is stimulated to grow into an embryo, which eventually gets transplanted into a surrogate mother.

The success of these two monkey clones suggests that it is technically possible to clone humans, and it could be done in a matter of months or years. This made many people wonder and worry about scientists cloning humans. However, the scientists mentioned that their purpose was to study diseases through the monkeys, and they will not attempt to do that.

This procedure raises serious ethical concerns. There has always been controversy when it comes to using non-human primates as lab animals. Some animal welfare groups view this particular event as cruel, especially since they are so similar to humans. Some scientists consider this unnecessary due to how advanced computer modeling is, while others believe that using non-human primates for certain research is unavoidable. There have been many reports on how lab animals tend to be mistreated, and that many cloned animals suffer from health issues due to the cloning process. Although experts believe that the ethical issues are too complex for them to come to a conclusion yet, it is still an issue that should be solved.
